# Proclamation

**WHEREAS**, "Ombuds" is a Scandinavian term that means "defender of the people's rights;" and

**WHEREAS**, today "Ombuds" generally refers to a person who may make an inquiry of an administrative action and tries to help the inquirer have the problem addressed fairly by the organization; and

**WHEREAS**, the Spokane City Charter established the office of police ombudsman in 2013 to provide the Spokane community access to services of an ombuds;

**WHEREAS**, disagreements, conflicts, complaints, confusion, and questions will inevitably arise in any government; and

**WHEREAS**, the fair and effective resolution of such issues is in the best interest of both the community and the City of Spokane, as it fulfills its mission of local governance; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Spokane acknowledges the benefit of providing an independent, impartial, and confidential resource whose role is to monitor complaints against the Spokane Police Department and independently investigate and publish reports with findings and recommendations;

**WHEREAS**, the American Bar Association has established October 14, 2021, as Ombuds Day in the United States.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Breean Beggs, Spokane City Council President, on behalf of the community members of Spokane, do hereby proclaim Thursday, October 14, 2021, as
